Zoom workshops</u> are not webinars.

Incorporating visual supports into children's lives is incredibly powerful for their development across many areas. Visuals provide a tangible way for children to comprehend information, communicate their needs, and navigate the world around them. By catering to different learning styles and needs, visual supports can level the playing field and promote inclusivity in childcare and educational settings.

This interactive and hands-on professional development session will explore various types of visual supports and discuss how each can be tailored to both support entire classrooms of children and meet the specific needs of individual children (ADHD, processing disorders, sensory difficulties, cognitive impairment, learning disabilities, emotional difficulties, language delays, ASD, FASD, and for those children learning English as an additional language). The workshops in the ethics series are a unique set of workshops. Some things to keep in mind when registering for an Ethics workshop:

- You must take the workshops in consecutive order beginning with Part I.
- If you took Part I prior to 2015 you may want to start your journey over.
- There must be at least 4 months between the time you attended Part III and taking Part IV.



There is nothing wrong with the "academic" expectations of the house such as reading, writing, math... the trouble is that many early childhood educators are being pressured to build a house where there is no foundation. Play is the foundation and through an investigation of the seven things Lisa shows you how.

She has written five books, produced numerous training videos, serves on several early childhood advisory boards, lectures both domestically and internationally, is a frequent guest on various early childhood podcasts and is the founder and CEO of Ooey Gooey, Inc.

Love and Limits: What Every Child Needs

When it comes to children, we know how we feel about love, but limits are another matter. There is so much to wonder about: Are limits good or bad? How many limits are enough? What kinds of limits are we talking about here? Who makes the limits? Who makes them work? Do they even work? All of these are valid questions, but in this session, it's really a matter of perspective; that is, how we look at limits. And we are going to consider limits as gifts we give children. We'll take a close look at this concept. Then we'll get down to the business of creating useful limits, communicating them to children and helping children thrive within the limits. We'll also examine how to say "no" in ways that are good for us as adults and good for children. This session reveals how beneficial good, strong limits are for young children, and how to "do limits" well.

FACILITATOR: Gretchen Kinnell has worked in the early childhood and adult education fields for over 50 years. Her experience includes teaching special education in Washington DC, serving as the education director of a Child Care Resource and Referral agency in Central New York, teaching child development courses at Onondaga Community College and consulting on a number of early literacy and social emotional development projects. She is the author of two books and accompanying booklets for parents on toddler care in child care settings. She has also been featured in *Parent Magazine* and was a contributing advice columnist on parenting issues for the Syracuse Post Standard for several years.

During her career she has developed and presented over a thousand workshops for people who work with young children and is known for presentations that feature practical approaches to issues, humor and warmth. She currently lives in Durham, North Carolina and where she continues to develop and present workshops on important issues for people who work with young children and their families.
