Morning Workshops

Best Choices: Ethics Part III

In Manitoba and Canada, those who work in early learning and child care environments have a Code of Ethics to guide our standards of practice. Using this code is a professional obligation. This four-part series occurs in a specific order, with each workshop a pre-requisite for the following session. The series helps us to use this code in our daily practice and continues to receive rave reviews. Here's your chance to join us in some serious fun! In this third step of your ethical journey, you will use MCCA's Code of Ethics as a tool and examine a process for ethical decision making. Again, the complexity of best choice decision making will be apparent, but you will feel like you know how to decide what should be considered prior to making that best choice.

Soothing the Soul

Behavior is communication and at times young children express themselves in ways that can be challenging. Everybody has different needs when it comes to coping with life's stressors. In this workshop we will explore how we can use the virtues project, literature, art and music to support children's social and emotional development. These tools and ideas will help to build community that support inclusion and wellbeing in our Early Childhood programs for all!

Whose in Charge Here Anyway

This workshop focuses on empowering children by giving them opportunities to take responsibility for their learning. We will explore strategies to encourage children to make choices, solve problems and participate in decision making. By shifting control to the children, educators can foster independence, develop leadership skills and create a more collaborative, engaging learning experience. Participants will leave with practical tools and techniques to help children grow in their sense of responsibility.

They are Real People! Making Infant Care Meaningful

This isn't your average infant workshop! In these two hours, your ideas and assumptions about what infant care involves will be tested as you are asked to reflect on the care that you provide, your assumptions about infants, and simple ways that you can make your day-to-day interactions more profound and meaningful for both you and the young minds you are shaping. If you've had someone comment to you that they love how you treat the babies in your room like real people, come share your knowledge! If you haven't, come learn what this can look like.

Jenna Poborsa- Jenna Poborsa has been in the childcare field for over 20 years, with most of it spent with Infants and Toddlers. She has training in Pedagogy, Resource for Infant Educarers (RIE philosophy) and is a Circle of Security facilitator. Learning Without Tears

In this workshop, Margaret will provide an overview of the development of visual-fine motor skills and provide information about the developmentally appropriate Learning Without Tears program. Specific objectives will include identifying and defining visual-fine motor skills, providing examples of activities that require visual-fine motor skills, identify the typical chronological progression of skills and activity that support typical development, as well as adaptations for children who struggle with their visual-fine motor skills. Participants will learn about the multi-sensory, hands-on activities that are taught in the Learning Without Tears pre-K program that can support kindergarten readiness skills including prewriting and writing skills and early literacy skills.

Margaret Loeppky- Margaret Loeppky is an Occupational Therapist that works out of Boundary Trails Health Centre in the Children & Youth Program within the therapy services department. She has worked for over 18 years with children ages birth to 21 years, providing preschool and school age outpatient services, contract services within Prairie Spirit School Division, and supporting families through the Jordan's Principle program in Swan Lake First Nation.

Afternoon Workshops

HANDLE WITH CARE-BUILDING BLOCK I: Developing Trust Between Practitioner and Child

Handle with Care is a program for promoting the mental health of young children in community based child care. Developed by the Canadian Mental Health Association and the Toronto based Hincks-Dellcrest Centre, this 9 unit program provides child care practitioners with ideas and strategies for promoting the mental health of children between ages 0 & 6.

Building Block 1 of the program focuses on the importance of children's early relationships with their adult caregivers and explores how these relationships lay the foundation for healthy psychosocial development. Using a variety of activities, participants will learn how to promote trusting relationships with the children they care for within the context of their child care centre.
