WORKSHOP CERTIFICATES

SUBSTITUTIONS

MCCA <u>does not offer refunds</u> for workshops. If you are unable to attend a workshop for any reason that you have registered for, you can send someone in your place as a substitute. Venture out: People who work together over a period of time will usually have the same work philosophies, experiences, ways in which things get done, etc. How about spreading your wings and connecting with people you don't know? Try sitting with new people or use the break out room as an opportunity to connect with new people, learn from each other, share your ideas, and network.

Participate: If you have signed up for a workshop, it is your obligation to fully participate in that workshop. Sharing your experiences may provide someone else with a solution to a dilemma that they have encountered or maybe your story will give someone a boost, or just a much needed laugh. <u>A Zoom workshop is a live event and participation is expected. Zoom workshops</u> are not webinars.

Closing Your Stress Loop: A deep dive, experiential day of the top 10 strategies and practices for self-regulation and a happier nervous system

Saturday, September 27, 2025 Suitable for: All 9:00 am - 3:00 pm PD Hours: 6

Feeling overwhelmed, on edge, or stuck in survival mode? If you're tired of trying to figure out what actually works to reduce stress and want practical tools that feel right for you, this hands-on day may be a timely choice. Rooted in evidence-based research and inspired by the work of the Nagoskis (authors of Burnout: The Secret to Unlocking the Stress Cycle), this full-day experiential workshop will help participants understand how to close the stress loop and find stability in times of chaos.

Through breathwork, gentle movement, creative practices, and mindful reflection, you'll explore strategies that support your nervous system and build lasting resilience. You'll leave with a personalized, repeatable toolkit for calm, clarity, and connection, both in your centre and at home.

Whether you need a reset or just some new tools, this day is about putting your well-being back on the map—with support, science, and space to breathe.

In this interactive session, participants will learn how to:

- · Understand your nervous system and where to start with regulation
- Close your stress loop and why it matters for your body, mind, and relationships
- Try out practical strategies, some quick, some creative, all backed by research
- Build your own go-to plan that feels realistic and meaningful
- Stay accountable when stress rises and motivation dips

Participants are on their own for lunch. There will be an hour lunch break. MCCA has a fridge, microwave, and a toaster oven for your convenience. There are several restaurants in the area.

FACILITATOR: Shannon Gander understands what it's like to work on the edge of burnout. She has also worked with multiple clients whose stress has impacted their ability to work and has contributed to short and long-term disability. Shannon is highly motivated to prevent this by equipping individuals and teams with skills for thriving through stress and preventing burnout. She also demonstrates how everyone can contribute to healthy organizational culture for better health, engagement and safety at work.

Drawing on her academic background in counselling, corporate health and conflict mediation, Shannon leaves participants with portable skills and practical strategies to apply right away from the boardroom, classroom, to the kitchen table.

Shannon is one of the authors in the book: Teacher Take Care – a guide to well-being and workplace wellness for educators. When not presenting, Shannon works in her private counselling practice in Winnipeg, Manitoba.





Every Child Belongs: Advancing Inclusion in Early Childhood Programs

Wednesday, October 15, 2025 6:30 pm - 8:30 pm

This workshop is the fourth of five in a series developed to support and enhance inclusive practices. The last of the series will be presented in the spring of 2026. We embrace inclusion and celebrate diversity as the means to foster the well-being of every child and thereby enrich our communities. All are entitled to full participation and support to meet their individual needs using a strength based, family centred approach, whereby we all learn from each other.

In this interactive workshop, participants will explore practical, strength-based strategies to support meaningful inclusion in early childhood settings. Designed in partnership with the Manitoba Child Care Inclusion Committee, the Manitoba Child Care Association, and Early Learning and Child Care Program, this session offers a deep dive into:

- 1. What inclusion *really* looks like in practice
- 2. The benefits of inclusive programs for children, families, and staff
- 3. Common barriers to inclusion and how to overcome them
- 4. Collaborative approaches to working with families and professionals
- 5. Using observations to foster and ensure inclusivity in your programs

Participants will engage in breakout discussions, explore real case studies, and leave with actionable tools to support inclusion in their own programs.

Whether you're a seasoned educator or just beginning to adapt your program to be more inclusive, this session offers practical insight, shared experiences, and a reaffirmation that *every child belongs*.

This session is one of five workshops that has been developed in partnership by the Manitoba Child Care Inclusion Committee, Manitoba Child Care Association, and the Manitoba Early Learning and Child Care Division. The workshops are fully funded by the federal government as part of the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement.

Preventing Disruptive Behaviours in the Early Years

If you are paying by credit card then you must register online. Go to mccahouse.org and click on the professional development button, select workshops, and then click on the link for online registration. Please avoid using auto-fill.

- Receipts will be emailed.
- If you are unable to attend a workshop that you have registered for and would like to send someone in your place (must be from the same centre and must be a replacing a member) email Debbie Crampton before 3:00 pm prior to the workshop at dcrampton@mccahouse.org. Debbie's direct line is 204-336-5065. We require the name and email of the replacement so that the Zoom link, any handouts, and certificate can be sent to the new person attending.
- There are no workshop refunds and this includes if the participant misses the workshop.
- To replace a "Certificate of Participation" the cost is \$10.00.
- Participants for Zoom workshops will receive a certificate of participation via email once 75% of participants have completed the
 workshop survey. Participants for in-person workshops will receive a paper certificate at the workshop.
