WHERE TO PARK?

There is no parking permitted in the Royal Bank Parking lot at any time (this includes evenings and Saturdays).

WORKSHOP CERTIFICATES

When you attend a workshop you will receive a certificate of participation. Each certificate will have the amount of workshop hours on it to help you track your professional development hours.

We would like to remind you if you are sending a substitute for a workshop and we do not receive a phone call with the name of the substitute before 3:00 pm prior to the workshop it will cost \$5.00 to re-issue the certificate, the \$5.00 is payable at the workshop. 
What MCCA will provide:

Prior to registering for a workshop please read over the Registration Procedures and Policies found on page 26 of this brochure. Manitoba has a fair share of snow in the winter. We do not cancel workshops due to snow and if you are out of town we caution you to remember that the road conditions can be unpredictable in the winter. If a workshop was to be cancelled we would send an email to the email address of the registration. ETHICS WORKSHOPS INFO

The workshops in the ethics series are a unique set of workshops. Some things to keep in mind when registering for an ethics workshop:

- You must take the workshops in consecutive order beginning with Part I.
- If you took Part I prior to 2004 you may want to start over as Part I is now a 3 hour workshop and it would be a good refresher.
- There must be at least 6 months between the time you attended Part III and taking Part IV.
- It is a good idea to leave some time between workshops so that you have time to reflect and practice what you have experienced in the workshop.
- Before signing up for an Ethics workshop you should have worked at least 6 months to a year in the child care field to gain some experience, this applies to child care assistants as well as early childhood educators.

The ethics workshops are like any other workshop, know why you are signing up to take this workshop. If you are a director who is registering staff for the ethics workshop, make sure it is for the right reason, communication problems cannot be fixed by taking an ethics workshop.

The Ethics Workshops fill up very quickly. Once they are full, the workshop is placed on our full list and no further registrations are taken. If you register for multiple parts and do not attend the first part you registered for, you cannot attend the following part and you will forfeit both workshop fees. For eg. You register for Part II & Part III at the same time but do not attend Part II, you will not be able to attend Part III and you will not receive a refund for EITHER workshop. You may still send a substitute, but they must have previously attended the pre-requisite workshop and you need to call Dianne at 204-336-5065 with the name of the substitute.

Currently, the Best Choices: Ethics workshops that are held in Winnipeg are at MCCA. We are open to have them held around the city if 5 or more centres in a particular area (for example St. James) want to get together and host an ethics workshop at one of the locations. 

What medical notes are appropriate? What is "reasonable"? This workshop will answer these questions, providing information surrounding your responsibilities and rights in the area of accommodation.

HANDLE WITH CARE - BUILDING BLOCK 1: Developing Trust Between Practitioner and Child

HAN - 001 Thursday, October 22, 2015 6:30 pm - 9:30 pm



Handle with Care is a program for promoting the mental health of young children in community based child care. Developed by the Canadian Mental Health Association and the Toronto based Hincks-Dellcrest Centre, this 9 unit program provides child care practitioners with ideas and strategies for promoting the mental health of children between ages 0 - 6.

Building Block 1 of the program focuses on the importance of children's early relationships with their adult caregivers and explores how these relationships lay the foundation for healthy psychosocial development. Using a variety of activities, participants will learn how to promote trusting relationships with the children they care for within the context of their child care centre.

Please note: If you have attended a previous Handle With Care workshop you would have received a Handle with Care Participant Training Manual, please bring this manual to this workshop with you. If this is your first HWC workshop a manual will be given to you at this workshop. Replacement manuals can be purchased from MCCA for \$12.00 and must be ordered at the time of registering for one of the workshops.

PREVENTING BURN OUT

In this workshop you will learn the fundamentals of Qigong, a very beneficial set of movements designed to bring balance and harmony back to the body, mind and spirit. You will also learn Basic EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique) or Tapping, which is a simple yet powerful technique that can help you improve your physical and emotional well-being, give you more freedom from your emotions, and help you help others.

Qigong (or chi kung) is an internal Chinese meditative practice, which often uses slow graceful movements and controlled breathing techniques to promote the circulation of qi (vital energy) within the body, and enhance a practitioner's overall health. People practice qigong to maintain health, heal their bodies, calm their minds, and reconnect with their spirit.

EFT is a form of psychological acupuncture that uses light tapping with your fingertips instead of inserting needles to stimulate traditional Chinese acupuncture points.

FACILITATOR: Carson Hill has been interested in and exploring Traditional Chinese healing practices and other natural healing modalities and practices since the mid-'90s, and has been equally fascinated with Buddhism since the early '90s. 

MINDFULNESS PRACTICE FOR ECES AND YOUNG CHILDREN

BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND!

What is "mindfulness"? Why would the practice of mindfulness be valuable to me? Why would this practice be valuable to the children I teach, to our centre, and to our families? How do I practice mindfulness myself and with other educators? What would mindfulness practices look, sound and feel like with young children? These are some of the questions we will explore during this 3-hour, experiential workshop.

Mindfulness is a practice of awareness. When we are being mindful, we are fully present in the "here and now" aware of our thoughts, feelings and bodies, as well as what is happening around us. Mindfulness begins with being aware of our breath, as we quiet and concentrate our minds, and as we bring about a sense of peacefulness. With patience and self-compassion over time we can learn to expand "mindful living" to everything we do, as we pause our thinking and "let go" of our worries, misgivings, and incessant planning. The first part of this workshop will focus on taking care of ourselves as early childhood educators, and as we practice healthy, happy, compassionate and ethical ways of being with children, other adults and the earth. The second part of the workshop will focus on playful ways of bringing mindfulness practice to young children (early childhood practices, stories and songs).

Please dress comfortably for practising.

FACILITATOR: Wayne Serebrin was an early childhood teacher and director, and an elementary classroom teacher before becoming a professor in the Faculty of Education at the University of Manitoba in 1990. The children love singing and moving, especially because they get to choose the movements! Her hope is to share what she has discovered.

DEALING WITH DIFFICULT PEOPLE

We all encounter people we find difficult. Typically conversations with them leave us feeling frustrated, stressed, angry and tired. This workshop will analyze what is happening in those exchanges and demonstrate how people can adapt their strategies to bring about more productive conversations with those they find difficult. Individual styles will be explored with an emphasis on understanding and adapting one's style to create different results. Participants will learn how to create the right conditions for a conversation with a person they find difficult. They will also learn how to positively engage the other in a discussion about the pattern of the difficult behaviour. This workshop gives participants a straightforward approach that creates dramatic change in the outcome of conversation with people they find difficult.

FACILITATOR: Mike Labun has over 18 years of experience in the mediation and conflict resolution field. He has a Certificate in Conflict Resolution and a Bachelor's degree in Psychology. He has developed several core workshops for ACHIEVE Training Centre including our Train-the-Trainer program and has contributed to many other courses for various organizations. In addition to his work with ACHIEVE Training Centre, he teaches conflict resolution at the University of Winnipeg. Since 2005, he and his wife Jodi have supervised a staff of 50, running a youth and children's program in Winnipeg's impoverished North End. Handle with Care is a program for promoting the mental health of young children in community based child care. Developed by the Canadian Mental Health Association and the Toronto based Hincks-Dellcrest Centre, this 9 unit program provides child care practitioners with ideas and strategies for promoting the mental health of children between ages 0 - 6.

Good communication with parents and other family members helps practitioners understand and be sensitive to family practices, expectations and values. It also provides opportunities for sharing concerns and strategizing about how children can be supported in the child care setting. Actively involving parents and families in meaningful ways creates partnerships that promote children's mental health. Participants will discuss how strategies linking parents to the centre may impact children's mental health and much more.

WEIGHTAND KIDS - A HEAVY BURDEN

This workshop had great reviews at the past MCCA conference so we invited Anna back to present it in our workshop series.

We frequently see childhood obesity identified as a serious problem in Canada that puts kids at risk for serious health problems like diabetes, heart disease, high blood pressure and asthma. There may also be social, psychological and emotional consequences like being excluded from activities or being teased. Kids who are unhappy with their weight are also more likely to develop eating disorders or depression. Given the risk of developing severe health consequences and the large potential cost to the health care system, there are many interventions to address overweight and obesity in children and teens. Do they make a difference? Are these interventions helping kids...or do they create another life-long set of problems.

Join Registered Dietitian Anna Pohorecky to discuss this complex issue and explore approaches to raising children who are healthy, happy and competent eaters.

FACILITATOR: Anna Pohorecky is a registered dietitian. She works primarily with teachers and educators, providing them with training and resources to teach nutrition to children in interesting, engaging and fun ways. In her time as part of the nutrition team at Dairy Farmers of Manitoba, Anna has facilitated many workshops all across Manitoba and has presented at numerous conferences. In the past Anna has also taken part in a local cooking show – The Great Tastes of Manitoba – where she regularly developed and demonstrated calcium rich recipes. Anna has also been a volunteer with Osteoporosis Canada, Manitoba Chapter since the late 90's, focusing her attention on delivering prevention messages to children, youth and their parents.
