Committee Mandate:

To advance the integrity of the early learning and child care field through the promotion of ethical practice.

Duties & Responsibilities:

1. Ensure the provision of ethics training throughout the Province of Manitoba.
2. Set standards and guidelines for quality of ethical training.
3. Collaborate with the Public Policy and Professionalism Committee on their work toward professionalism.
4. Collaborate with the Canadian Child Care Federation regarding national ethics training.

Composition of the Committee:

The committee shall consist of guides who have completed the 4 part series and a train the trainer program. The committee shall appoint a chairperson and a representative to the Public Policy and Professionalism Committee.

MCCA staff support and technology will be provided by MCCA

Time Requirements:

Meetings are held as required. Members of the committee are expected to attend meetings, guide workshops as appropriate, and contribute to the committee work to be considered active on the committee.

Accountability:

Members of the committee are accountable to the MCCA Board of Directors through the Executive Director.

Operational Policies:

1. All members of the Ethics Committee shall adhere to high standards including confidentiality of committee information, especially in regards to information that is verbally presented or written and is of a sensitive nature and has been deemed to be CONFIDENTIAL.
2. Committee members must be MCCA members in good standing; must sign a Confidentiality Agreement; must attend a majority of meetings of the committee held each year in order to remain eligible to participate.
3. Committee members must bring knowledge, expertise, and awareness of issues specific to this committee, and be non-partisan and objective.
4. Members of this committee must, in the opinion of other committee members and the MCCA Board of Directors, be free of any relationship that would interfere with his or her exercise of independent judgment.
5. A majority of the members of the committee must be present in person or by phone to constitute a quorum.
6. Committee members may be asked to act on activities as referred from the MCCA Board of Directors.
7. Committees will operate in accordance with MCCA's Volunteer Manual.
8. The Committee shall elect a chairperson for a two year term.
