Managing challenging behaviours PD session

Preschoolers have big emotions and helping them move through these feelings can be challenging to say the least! In this session we'll talk about why these big feelings happen and what we as caregivers can do – and not do! - to help our children return to calm.

Session will include:

- · sensory processing 101
- · dysregulation: what happens in our brains and bodies during a meltdown
- · the importance of co-regulation; what we as caregivers bring to a meltdown
- · an introduction to the Low Arousal Approach (information only, not to be considered formal training)
- · Q&A

Carla Betker is a School Psychologist with nearly 30 years of experience working with children with diverse learning and mental health issues from Kindergarten to Grade 12. She has extensive assessment and consultation experience, assisting school teams in meeting students' needs and facilitating their success academically, socially, and behaviourally. Carla also has a private counselling practice where she works directly with children, youth, and adults struggling with depression, anxiety, low self-esteem, and a host of related difficulties. She has presented professional development seminars to counsellors, teachers, educational assistants, school administrators and other professionals, as well as information sessions to parents.

This will be a 3-hour workshop which will provide an overview of depression, anxiety, and ADHD, as well as strategies for helping children cope and be more successful socially and behaviourally within a childcare setting.
