Rethinking Risk: The Importance of Children's Outdoor Risky Play for Children's Health, Well-Being and Development

Research is clear on the importance of regular and repeated access to outdoor risky play opportunities in childhood. Despite the known benefits of outdoor risky play, Canadian children's play experiences have become more monitored and controlled over time. This workshop explores the importance of outdoor risky play on children's health, development, and well-being, and the important role that educators and child care providers play in facilitating this form of play. Through this session, you will learn the key concepts that support outdoor risky play and how you can begin to incorporate these into your work with children. This is an interactive workshop that will work through real examples from the field, outline how to identify a hazard from a risk, and how to communicate with parents about outdoor risky play. Rachel Ramsden will guide workshop participants in developing a deeper understanding of how outdoor risky play can support and provide opportunities for children to explore the world and their own capabilities.

Rachel Ramsden is a Research Coordinator at the Play Outside Lab and a PhD Candidate in the School of Population and Public Health at the University of British Columbia. Working with Dr. Mariana Brussoni, Rachel leads research projects in BC and across Canada that aim to support children's outdoor and risky play. Rachel has a particular interest in understanding how different outdoor environments facilitate children's outdoor and risky play across all age groups. Rachel previously worked in schoolage care, recreation, and community planning, and she has a Master of Public Health (2016) and a Bachelor of Kinesiology (2013).

Critical Literacy

What power do books hold? Through this workshop educators will discuss topics of social justice and diversity, considering how all children can feel represented. We will focus on understanding the importance of representation in children's day to day lives and on the power that books can hold.

This involves looking at how books can uphold ideas of colonization, gender stereotypes, one type of family and white-centric voices. We will look at how the literacy we use can work towards anti-racist & anti-bias practice, as well as create a welcoming environment where all children are able to feel represented. Not limited to cultures, but also consideration of children with exceptionalities, various family structures, LGBTQ2S+, and looking outside of the gender binary and stereotypes. Focusing on the critical literacy theory, educators will have a chance to discover new authors and books that will help to diversify their bookshelves and develop skills that allow them to critically assess and choose books within their learning environments.

Embracing Tensions: Encounters with Tough Topics

In educational settings we often encounter tough topics, such as death, divorce, global warming, racism, sexism, colonial histories, disability awareness, and LGBTQ2S+ topics. How do we respond when tensions around tough topics arise? This workshop addresses why it's important to critically engage with children, how to have conversations with families, and ways to engage with tough topics. We will look at what it means to embrace the tensions in our educational settings and what can grow from engaging with said tensions. The goal of this workshop is that educators will leave feeling more confident in their abilities to engage with tensions and tough topics within their settings.

Educators in attendance will have the opportunity to write down and submit or ask the tough questions from the perspective of a school age child and they will be answered collaboratively with Ashleigh!

Ashleigh Davies is an early childhood educator with her bachelors in ECCE and has worked with children in a variety of roles over the last decade.

Ashleigh has worked as a post-secondary instructor, leading ECE post-basic courses, and currently is the CAPC Coordinator and Parent Community Liaison with North Shore Community Resources and leads community of practices with her local CCRR.
