At MCCA we strive to provide our members with professional development opportunities that are relevant, presented by professionals, and offer opportunities to learn. We want your workshop experience to be an uplifting and valuable one so we have a few suggestions that can help you accomplish this.

Sharing your experiences may provide someone else with a solution to a dilemma that they have encountered or maybe your story will give someone a boost, or just a much needed laugh. <u>A Zoom workshop is a live event and participation is expected. Zoom workshops are not webinars.</u>

In Manitoba and Canada, those who work in early learning and child care environments have a Code of Ethics to guide our standards of practice. Using this code is a professional obligation.

This four-part series occurs in a specific order, with each workshop a pre-requisite for the following session. The series helps us to use this code in our daily practice and continues to receive rave reviews. Here's your chance to join us in some serious fun!

This capstone workshop will help you to make a commitment of ethical practice in your daily work and enhance your awareness of your own values, beliefs and assumptions. You will also understand why, when faced with an ethical dilemma, it is difficult to follow through with your best choice. ETHICS WORKSHOPS INFO

The workshops in the ethics series are a unique set of workshops. Some things to keep in mind when registering for an Ethics workshop:

- · You must take the workshops in consecutive order beginning with Part I.
- If you took Part I prior to 2013 you may want to start over as Part I is now a 3 hour workshop and it would be a good refresher. If it has been over five years since you have taken Part I, you might want to start over.
- There must be at least 4 months between the time you attended Part III and taking Part IV.
- It is a good idea to leave some time between workshops so that you have time to reflect and practice what you have experienced in the workshop.
- Before signing up for an Ethics workshop yaou should have worked at least 4 months to a year in the child care field to gain some experience, this applies to child care assistants as well as early childhood educators.

The Ethics workshops are like any other workshop, know why you are signing up to take this workshop. If you are a director who is registering staff for the Ethics workshops, make sure it is for the right reason, communication problems cannot be fixed by taking an Ethics workshop.

The Ethics workshops fill up very quickly. Once they are full, the workshop is placed on our full list and no further registrations are taken. If you register for multiple parts and do not attend the first part you registered for, you cannot attend the following part and you will forfeit both workshop fees, eg. you register for Part II & Part III at the same time but do not attend Part II, you will not be able to attend Part III and you will not receive a refund for EITHER workshop. You may still send a substitute, but they must have previously attended the pre-requisite workshop and you need to call Dianne at 204-336-5065 with the name of the substitute.



Strategic Planning for Cohesive Board and Management

This workshop will take you through the process of strategic planning for valuing diversity on the road to consensus.

Child care centres need vibrant relevant strategic plans like any other non profit.

However, it can be challenging to find the time and the funds to do the process and project justice. And there are funding sources that recognize how crucial a strategic plan is and are willing to fund those projects, in part. The old model of strategic planning involved gathering the Board and Management or even all staff for a 1-1.5 day to undertake the whole process; Reviewing the past plan, conducting and environmental scan, brainstorming and setting priorities.

While plans were developed that way, that concentrated method creates a feeling of being under pressure or under duress, which is not conducive to strong teamwork and building consensus. if you want to get the most out of your planning process it is much better do it over months, gradually. The process of developing the plan is as valuable as the plan itself!

Engaging stakeholder groups through surveys and possibly focus groups, builds a deeper sense of belonging and commitment from those stakeholder groups, as well as increases the quality and relevance of the plan.

The final step is pulling all the feedback together and sharing it with Board and management and giving them time to digest it, discuss it before they aim to achieve consensus on the priorities. This style of gradual process animates high engagement which is a dividend that can last for years and help fuel the Board and management into the implementation stage. While it takes patience, the gradual gaining of momentum allows for ease of consensus at the final stage.
