I have a beautiful grandson and his name is Tyler who is 18 years old, and I have 2 brothers. I was taken to IRS at a noticeably young age of 5 years old and was sent away for 14 years into this dark period of my life. Both my parents were former students who had faced many challenges in their lives. I have had my struggles over the years through my healing journey I have reconnected with my culture and identity. By learning the traditional ways and practicing them has given me strength, courage and knowledge to continue living a positive life. My healing journey continues by learning the traditional ways and practicing them, as this is where I get my strength, courage, and knowledge to continue liv-

ing a positive life. These teachings of the traditional ways help me to recognize and leave harmful relationships and gives me the courage & ability to pursue anything I want to do. I am now in control of my life and am proud to say that I was a single parent who raised my 3 children the best way I could. I was involved with Woman's Warrior Circle for 7 years, who is made up of a group of strong, beautiful women, Grandmothers, Mothers, Sisters and Daughters who are dedicated to making our communities, our homes, and ourselves a safer place to live. Another group I was proud to be involved with for 6 years is Mama Bear Clan. This group is led by our Women and supported by our Men. Mama Bear Clan patrols our streets and the community of North Point Douglas to check up on our families and make sure everyone is safe. At present I am employed full time as a Resolution Health Support Worker at Anish Corporation helping other IRS thrivers like myself find new paths to healing and stay active in the indigenous community. Through the accomplishment of these achievements I am proud to help give back to my community and use my experiences to inspire others to follow their dreams.

#### ETHICS WORKSHOPS INFO

The workshops in the ethics series are a unique set of workshops. Some things to keep in mind when registering for an Ethics workshop:

- You must take the workshops in consecutive order beginning with Part I.
- If you took Part I prior to 2013 you may want to start over as Part I is now a 3 hour workshop and it would be a good refresher. If it has been over five years since you have taken Part I, you might want to start over.
- There must be at least 4 months between the time you attended Part III and taking Part IV.
- It is a good idea to leave some time between workshops so that you have time to reflect and practice what you have experienced in the workshop.
- Before signing up for an Ethics workshop you should have worked at least 4 months to a year in the child care field to gain some experience, this applies to child care assistants as well as early childhood educators.

The Ethics workshops are like any other workshop, know why you are signing up to take this workshop. If you are a director who is registering staff for the Ethics workshops, make sure it is for the right reason, communication problems cannot be fixed by taking an Ethics workshop.

The Ethics workshops fill up very quickly. Once they are full, the workshop is placed on our full list and no further registrations are taken. If you register for multiple parts and do not attend the first part you registered for, you cannot attend the following part and you will forfeit both workshop fees, eg. you register for Part II & Part III at the same time but do not attend Part II, you will not be able to attend Part III and you will not receive a refund for EITHER workshop. You may still send a substitute, but they must have previously attended the pre-requisite workshop and you need to call Debbie at 204-336-5065 with the name of the substitute.

Families have the most important role and influence on a child's well-being and learning. The Bowen Family Systems (BFS) theory, a leading family therapy theory, can help to understand the influence a family's emotional functioning can have on a child's well being, ability to learn and life outcomes. In the Early Learning field we are constantly engaging with family systems, an awareness of how families may be functioning emotionally can help inform our work.

The BFS theory is primarily about how we are shaped by the emotional systems we exist in, how those systems are connected and are affected by one another. Reflecting on our own experiences in our family systems can help us see where they may impact our work.

The concepts of families as an emotional unit, emotional systems, anxiety binding behaviours and how they affect family systems and the individuals in them, along with much more will be introduced in this workshop. All concepts in BFS theory apply to non-family groups, including work environments. This workshop will provide opportunities for both reflection and active engagement.
